

Intent, Content and Progression Route Map Art and Design

Intent:

The aim of the Art and Design Curriculum at Trinity Academy New Bridge is to create opportunities for all learners to learn a wide variety of skills and to build confidence using a variety of Art materials. We encourage all our learners to experiment with specialisms such as Painting, Ceramics, Textiles, Photography, and Print making. Learners are encouraged to be creative, experimental and expressive with their work and the materials that they use. This will build confidence and learners will be able to make informed choices about progression and development of their work in the Art room. KS3 focuses on the learners understanding the importance of Artist Research and understanding of Key Art Movements to inspire their work. Skills are consistently built upon and developed throughout KS3 through to KS4. The curriculum Ensures key / threshold concepts are introduced early in a school career and recur often, each year group builds upon prior knowledge and can make links to other modules they are learning in different subjects. Students in KS3 have had the opportunity to develop skills, understanding and knowledge of the formal elements of art. They will know how they can use the work of artists to inspire their work going forward into KS4. When Studying Art Pathway at Trinity Academy New Bridge, we build on the skills, knowledge and experience our learners have gained in KS3. We offer students the opportunity to meet the AQA Assessment Objectives when studying projects and ensure they have the opportunities to continue to creatively express themselves to the best of their ability.
