
Word of the week

Integrity

[in-teg-ri-tee]

<u>Origin</u>

from Old French integrité or directly from Latin integritatem (nominat ive integritas) "soundness, wholeness, completeness," figuratively "purity, correctness, blamelessness," from *integer* "whole" (see integer). Sense of "wholeness, perfect condition" is mid-15c.

- Integrity, as defined by the dictionary, is "the quality of being honest or having strong moral principles." People with integrity are generally known to be trustworthy, honest, and kind. This is a quality that everyone should strive for.
- Additionally, everyone should also strive to surround themselves with people who have true integrity.

How can you tell that someone has what is considered *true* integrity?

It isn't something that can be faked, but there are some ways to tell that someone has real integrity and are not just faking it. Here are the main behaviours that reveal if someone has the kind of integrity you want in a person.

HERE ARE 10 BEHAVIORS THAT SIGNIFY SOMEONE HAS TRUE INTEGRITY

- 1. TAKING RESPONSIBILITY FOR THEIR ACTIONS
- 2. PUTTING OTHERS' NEEDS ABOVE THEIR OWN
- 3. OFFERING TO HELP OTHERS IN NEED
- 4. GIVING OTHERS THE BENEFIT OF THE DOUBT
- 5. CHOOSING HONESTY IN ALL THINGS
- 6. SHOWING RESPECT TO EVERYONE
- 7. MANIFESTING HUMILITY (BEING HUMBLE)
- 8. BEING ABLE TO ADMIT THEY'RE WRONG
- 9. SHOWING REGULAR RELIABILITY
- 10. CONVEYING TRUE KINDNESS
