

Noun

- a fact, occurrence, or circumstance observed or observable: to study the phenomena of nature.
- something that is impressive or extraordinary.
- a remarkable or exceptional person; prodigy; wonder.
- Philosophy.an appearance or immediate object of awareness in experience.
- Kantianism. a thing as it appears to and is constructed by the mind, as distinguished from a noumenon, or thing-in-itself.

Origin of the word










Phenomenon – lightning from a volcano eruption



Phenomenon – 'Blood falls'



Blood Falls, in one of the driest regions of Antarctica, is fed by an underground lake. It's full of bacteria scientists want to study because they fuel themselves with sulfates, instead of sugars like we do.

The water has so much iron in it that it <u>literally rusts</u> when it meets air, giving the waterfall its trademark color.
