

Phenomenon

Noun

- a particular tendency, trend, inclination, feeling, or opinion, especially one that is preconceived or unreasoned: *illegal bias against older job applicants; the magazine's bias toward art rather than photography; our strong bias in favour of the idea.*
- unreasonably hostile feelings or opinions about a social group; prejudice: *accusations of racial bias*.
- an oblique or diagonal line of direction, especially across a woven fabric.
- *Statistics*. a systematic as opposed to a random distortion of a statistic as a result of sampling procedure.

Phenomenon

The desire to do the opposite of what is requested or see advised, due to a perceived threat to freedom of choice

When offered information that conflicts with your original understanding, it can be hard to admit you were wrong or ill-informed. Ask if you are objecting to advice simply because it is interfering with your ego.
